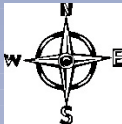

for them to Kansas City so Gypsy Rose can receive specialized care at Children's Mercy Hospital. AFC also arranges flights for Barbara, Kansas City, Missouri who participates in a clinical trial at MD Anderson, Houston, Texas for pancreatic cancer. AFC Passenger celebrates Angel Flight experience during difficult time

“Throughout our cancer treatments there have been many terrifying experiences and some incredible blessings. Yesterday, our flight with you was a blessing of unparalleled magnitude.”

Karen and Todd don't know what the future will hold except that it will continue to include many doctor appointments. Their story began in 2000, when doctors discovered a tumor in Karen's right leg. They removed the cancer, and she received chemo and radiation therapy. However, it didn't stop there. Karen has subsequently been diagnosed and treated for breast cancer, has endured two open heart surgeries and an operation on her trachea, all to remove cancerous tumors. Last year, they found another mass, between her heart and lungs, but this time, Karen was told it was inoperable.

Karen and Todd now spend precious time with their family making as many memories as possible. They are also making video tapes of Karen for their children to play at graduations, weddings, and special occasions. Because of the travel necessary for her medical care, some time has also been spent with AFC Volunteer Pilots. According to Karen and Todd, that has been a wonderful blessing. “We have been blessed by Angel Flight. Last year we were able to fly (a donated flight) on a Lear Jet... luxury at its finest. Yet our experience with AFC was so much more rewarding,”

said Todd. “The pilots, their passion for helping people in times of need, made our spirits soar. What amazing acts of kindness these generous souls provide during a frightening chapter in our family.”

Throughout this ordeal, Karen and Todd have remained hopeful. On their last trip to MD Anderson, they were told that Karen's tumor has not grown for 6 months, while she has not been on any treatment. According to Todd, their “hope is stretched but not lost” as they continue, grateful for new friendships including those with AFC Volunteers.

Angel Flight Ambassadors Bring Message of Hope to Outlying Areas

If you or someone you know are passionate about the service AFC provides to the hundreds of families and individuals who need access to health care, then consider becoming an Angel Flight Central Ambassador. This flexible and important volunteer role is perfect for the pilot or non pilot alike and is a critical element of AFC's ability to communicate with small communities.

The main roles of the Angel Flight Ambassador are to focus quarterly on one of four outreach areas: Pilot Recruitment and Activities (visiting your local airports), Passenger and Community Awareness (visiting your area hospital and sharing Angel Flight with local organizations), Public Relations (talking with your local newspaper, radio and television station) and Friend-raising (introducing potential supporters and volunteers to Angel Flight).

Ambassadors often live in rural areas or within communities whose residents are unaware of Angel Flight, but may need our free transportation service the most. The area Wing leadership provides support, training, and contacts for Ambassadors and can assist at meetings and presentations. The Wing Leader often knows what outreach methods work best.

"I suggest ideas or projects to do on a regular basis such as visiting churches and synagogues, hanging posters at the local general aviation airport, and visiting healthcare clinics to distribute brochures," explains Great Lake Wing Passenger and Community Awareness Leader, Geri McKeown. "The activities

are simple and not very time consuming; however, they can have a huge impact if someone in their community is helped through our mission."

What is an Angel Flight Ambassador?

A volunteer committed to the AFC mission of serving people in need through charitable aviation.

An important link to small communities within AFC's 10 state region.

A pilot or non pilot volunteer "spreading the word" about Angel Flight.

Vital to our success in helping more people in need throughout the Midwest!

Whether speaking in an informal setting to a small group or a largely attended formal function, the AFC staff can provide the tools - The Angel Flight Outreach Kit - to present our mission in an informative and enjoyable way.

The kit includes:

- Several PowerPoint presentations designed for specific audiences.
- Promotional materials such as posters, magnets, newsletters, and brochures.
- A DVD that explains our mission and tells our story with photos, songs, and messages from key staff, and local and national media.
- A table top display for use at health fairs, air shows, and other community events.
- DVD copies of national news stories that ran on the NBC "Today Show" and Fox News Network.
- Updated statistics and helpful hints for speaking on behalf of AFC.

ON BOARD: PILOT NEWS AND NOTES

In order to streamline and improve mission coordination and communication, your AFC Missions Team requests the following procedural changes:

Completed Missions - You no longer need to call Angel Flight to report a completed mission. Please log on to AFIDS within 24-48 hours after your flight and file a mission completion report including your hobbs time.

Questions or comments - Please email questions, comments, requests, etc. to a Mission Coordinator at request@angelflightcentral.org. If the coordinator you are trying to reach is not in the office, someone else can help you.

What is an active Mission Pilot? The AFC Board of Directors defines an active Mission Pilot as “one who has reaffirmed his/her membership every 12 months and has flown at least one mission within 24 months.” Only active members may fly a mission and participate in HSEATS.

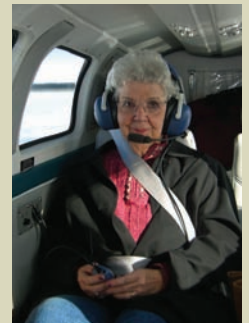
